IEA has so far organised 104 annual conferences in different parts of the country. The last conference was held at Atal Bihari Vajpayee Institute of Good Governance and Policy Analysis, Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh.

Message from the Vice Chancellor JAIN (Deemed-to-be University)



He has worked in Presidency College, Kolkata (1979-83), Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics, Pune (1983-87); Indian Institute of Foreign Trade, Delhi (1987-93); National Council of Applied Economic Research (1995-96); Rajiv Gandhi Institute for Contemporary Studies (1997-2005); Chamber of Commerce and Industry (2005-06); and Centre for Policy Research (2007-2015) Dr. Debroy was also Member, NITI Aayog up to 5th June 2019. He has authored/edited several books, papers and popular articles.



Prof. Ramesh Chand is currently Member, NITI Aayog, in the rank and status of a Union Minister of State. He has a Ph.D in agricultural economics from the Indian Agricultural Research Institute (IARI), New Delhi. He is a Fellow of the National Academy of Agricultural Sciences and the Indian Society of Agricultural Economics. He has been involved in policy formulation for the agriculture sector for the past two and a half decades. Prior to joining NITI Aayog, he was Director, National Institute of Agricultural Economics and Policy Research, New Delhi.



Dr. Arvind Virmani is the Founder Chairman of the Foundation for Economic Growth and Welfare (EGROW) and President of the Forum for Strategic Initiative (FSIdelhi.org).He served as a member of the Technical Advisory Committee of RBI on Monetary Policy from February 2013 to August 2016, as Mentor (Public Policy) to FICCI during 2015-16 and 2016-17. He was till end-2012, Executive Director at the International Monetary Fund (IMF), Washington DC, representing India (as its Ambassador to IMF), Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and Bhutan. He has been an adviser to the Indian Government at the highest levels for 25 years, including as Chief Economic Adviser, Ministry of Finance and Principle Adviser, Planning Commission



Prof. Sachin Chaturvedi is currently Director General at the Research and Information System for Developing Countries (RIS), a New Delhi-based Think-Tank. Currently, he is also Vice Chairman, Atal Bihari Vajpayee Institute of Good Governance and Policy Analysis; and ex-officio Vice Chairman of Madhya Pradesh State Policy and Planning Commission. He is also Member, Board of Governors, Reserve Bank of India.



Prof. V.K. Malhotra has recently been appointed as Chairman, Food Commission of Madhya Pradesh. He has served as Member Secretary, Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), Government of India, New Delhi for two consecutive terms (October 2016 to 2022). He has earlier served at C.C.S University as Head and Professor of Economics. His research interests include Governance and Economic Development, Corporate Governance and Performance, Intellectual Property Rights and India's Concerns, Foreign Trade and Investments etc.



Prof. M Suresh Babu is member of the Economic Advisory Council to Prime Minister of India. He is Professor of Economics at Indian Institute of Technology, Madras. He did Ph.D. from the Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. His areas of Research are Applied Macroeconomics, Industrial Economics, and Trade and Development. His publication include recent book titled "What and How do Indian Firms Innovate? jointly with K K Subrahmanian.



Prof. V. R. Panchamukhi is an Indian Economist and Sanskrit scholar. He contributed to the field of economics in multiple ways. His work on the applications of game theory to International Trade Policy analysis was noted as a pioneering work by Jagdish Bhagwati. He worked on development models and resource gaps for the countries of the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP) region that were presented under the leadership of Nobel Laureate Jan Tinbergen while he was a staff member of the ESCAP (then ECAFE). He was invited to work at the South Centre (organization), Geneva, by Julius Nyerere, the former President of Tanzania, and the then Chairman of the group.



Dr. Charan Singh is the former Non-Executive Chairman of Punjab & Sind Bank. He was full time visiting faculty and former RBI Chair Professor (Dec 2012 to Dec 2016) at the Indian Institute of Management Bangalore, India where he taught comparative monetary policy and policy issues in Indian economy.




