Thanks to the initiative taken by Charles Joseph Hamilton, then Minto Professor of Economics at Calcutta University, and a score of economists, mostly teachers, who met in Calcutta in December 1917 to deliberate on economics. IEA is the oldest Association in Social Sciences and perhaps second oldest in the country in any discipline, after the Indian Science Congress Association (founded in 1914). IEA organizes annual conferences, seminars, and lectures by eminent persons of the profession. It stands for promoting the interest of the discipline in terms of extension, expansion and professional competence in teaching, training, research, and consultancy. Shri Suman Bery is currently Hon'ble Vice Chairperson, NITI Aayog, in the rank and status of a Cabinet Minister. He was a Senior Visiting Fellow at the Centre for Policy Research, New Delhi; a Global Fellow in the Asia Programme of the Woodrow Wilson International Centre for Scholars in Washington D.C.; and a non-resident fellow at Bruegel, an economic policy research institution in Brussels. He was also a member of the Board of the Shakti Sustainable Energy Foundation, New Delhi. During 2012-16, Mr Bery was Royal Dutch Shell's global Chief Economist based in The Hague. Earlier, he served as Director-General (Chief Executive) of the National Council of Applied Economic Research (NCAER) in New Delhi.



Prof. Ramesh Chand is currently Member, NITI Aayog, in the rank and status of a Union Minister of State. He has a PhD in agricultural economics from the Indian Agricultural Research Institute (IARI), New Delhi. He is a Fellow of the National Academy of Agricultural Sciences and the Indian Society of Agricultural Economics. He has been involved in policy formulation for the agriculture sector for the past two and a half decades. Prior to joining NITI Aayog, he was Director, National Institute of Agricultural Economics and Policy Research, New Delhi.



Dr. Arvind Virmani is the full time Member, NITI Aayog. He earlier served as Chairman of the Foundation for Economic Growth and Welfare (EGROW) and President of the Forum for Strategic Initiatives (FSI, Delhi). He served as a member of the Technical Advisory Committee of RBI on Monetary Policy during 2013-16, as Mentor (Public Policy) to FICCI during 2015-16 and 2016-17. He was till end-2012, Executive Director at the International Monetary Fund (IMF), Washington DC, representing India (as its Ambassador to IMF), Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and Bhutan. He has been an adviser to the Indian Government at the highest levels for 25 years, including as Chief Economic Adviser, Ministry of Finance; and Principal Adviser, Planning Commission.



Dr. Shamika Ravi is currently a member of the Economic Advisory Council to Prime Minister of India. Earlier, she was non-resident senior fellow of the governance studies program at the Brookings Institution Washington D.C. Prior to that she was Director of Research at Brookings India. She did her PhD in Economics from New York University, Masters in Economics from Delhi School of Economics and B.A(H) in Economics from Lady Shri Ram College. Her areas of research are economics of development, finance, health, urbanization and gender inequality.



Prof. Yogesh Singh is the 23rd Vice Chancellor of Delhi University. He became full Professor of Computer Engineering in the Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi. He is Chairman of Governing Board of Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) Centre, Gandhinagar. He has been member of the Executive Committee of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with effect from October 03, 2019. He is also serving as the Additional Director (Non-Executive, Independent Director) on the Board of Director of Gujarat Gas.



Prof. Sachin Chaturvedi is currently Director General at the Research and Information System for Developing Countries (RIS), a New Delhi-based Think-Tank. He is also Member, Board of Governors, Reserve Bank of India. Earlier, he was Vice Chairman, Atal Bihari Vajpayee Institute of Good Governance and Policy Analysis; and ex-officio Vice Chairman of Madhya Pradesh State Policy and Planning Commission. He works on issues related to development economics, involving development finance, SDGs and South-South Cooperation, apart from trade, investment and innovation linkages with special focus on WTO.



Prof. M Suresh Babu is member of the Economic Advisory Council to Prime Minister of India. He is Professor of Economics at Indian Institute of Technology, Madras. He did Ph.D. from the Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. His areas of Research are Applied Macroeconomics, Industrial Economics, and Trade and Development. His publication includes recent book titled "What and How do Indian Firms Innovate? jointly with K K Subrahmanian.



Shri S.K. Arya is the Chairman of Jay Bharat Maruti Limited (JBM) Group, a \$2.6bn global conglomerate with operations in more than 25 locations across 10 countries throughout the world. He is the world's leading manufacturers of key auto systems, electric vehicles and buses. He embarked into the journey with LPG gas cylinder manufacturing unit in Haryana in 1983 under JBM industries Ltd. In the next four years he entered into automotive component industry by clinching a joint venture with Maruti Suzuki India. Today Group's over 90% revenue comes from automotive business. Now, he dreams of having a JBM in every vehicle on the India road.



Dr. Charan Singh is the Non-Executive Chairman of Punjab & Sind Bank. He was full time visiting faculty and former RBI Chair Professor (Dec 2012 to Dec 2016) at the Indian Institute of Management Bangalore, India where he taught comparative monetary policy and policy issues in Indian economy. He served as Senior Economist at IMF, Washington during 2009-2012.



Prof. V.K. Malhotra has recently been appointed as Chairman, Food Commission of Madhya Pradesh. He has served as Member Secretary, Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), Government of India, New Delhi for two consecutive terms (October 2016 to 2022). He has earlier served at C.C.S University as Head and Professor of Economics. His research interests include Governance and Economic Development, Corporate Governance and Performance, Intellectual Property Rights and India's Concerns, Foreign Trade and Investments etc.



Professor Bhushan Patwardhan is the National Research Professor-Ayush and a Distinguished Professor of Health Sciences at Savitribai Phule Pune University. His main body of work has been in evidenced-based Ayurveda, ethnopharmacology, drug development, and the role of traditional medicines in public health. He served as the Director of the Interdisciplinary School of Health Sciences at Savitribai Phule Pune University; Vice-Chairman of the University Grants Commission; and Chairman, National Assessment and Accreditation Council.



Dr. R Balasubramaniam (Balu) is a Member-Human Resource of the Capacity Building Commission, New Delhi. He is a widely respected development expert, public policy analyst, leadership trainer and author. He has spent several decades living and working among forest based tribal communities in the southern Indian district of Mysore. He founded the Swami Vivekananda Youth Movement, a renowned development organization and is also the founder of Grassroots Research and Advocacy Movement, a public policy think tank.



Shri Amarjeet Singh is a Whole Time Member, Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI), Mumbai. Earlier, he was Executive Director in SEBI. With his nearly three decades of service in SEBI, he has wide experience in regulation and supervision of securities markets. He has acted as Sherpa for SEBI's representation on the Board of International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO) during 2010-17. He was instrumental in bringing about various primary market reforms.



Dr. Saumya Kanti Ghosh is the Group Chief Economic Advisor of State Bank of India. He has been a co-author of a pioneering work to capture payroll data in India for the first time, both formal and informal, and associated with designing the PM-KISAN scheme for farmers and the ECLG scheme for MSME borrowers. He is a member of a working group set up by the Government of India for the revision of the Wholesale Price Index. He also serves as chairman of the Indian Banks' Association's Economist Group.



Shri Govinda Rajulu Chintala is a former Chairman, National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD), Mumbai. Earlier he served as Deputy Managing Director of the NABARD. He joined NABARD as grade-B officer in 1985, and held several positions across the country before becoming deputy MD in 2019. He did his post-graduation in seed science and technology from Indian Agriculture Research Institute (IARI) in 1986. He is a senior agriculture scientist from the Guntur district in Andhra Pradesh.



Dr. Yogesh Suri is currently working as Senior Adviser at NITI Aayog. He has more than 13 years of long experience of administrator and policy analyst. He had also served as Director General at National Institute of Labour Economics Research and Development from 2014 to 2017. Before that he contributed his excellence as Chief Economist at State Bank of Bikaner and Jaipur and as Assistant General Manager in Small Industries Development Bank of India. An allumini of Delhi University, he had done doctorate degree in area of Financial Inclusion from Rajasthan University.



Dr Pritam Banerjee is Professor & Head, Centre for WTO Studies, Indian Institute of Foreign Trade, New Delhi. He was a Consultant with the Asian Development Bank (ADB) as a Logistics Sector Specialist. Earlier, he was Senior Director for Public Policy with the Deutsche Post DHL Group, responsible for South Asia. He served as the Head of Trade Policy, Confederation of Indian Industry's (CII) Trade Policy Division, and with the World Bank in Washington, D.C., where his work focused trade facilitation and trade in services.



Prof. Surender Kumar is a Senior Professor and Head, Department of Economics, Delhi School of Economics, University of Delhi. He had been the Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Delhi. His previous stint involves the position of Professor of Economics at the Department of Business Economics, University of Delhi, South Campus, Professor of Economics at the Department of Policy Studies, TERI University, New Delhi and Fellow at NIPFP, New Delhi.



Prof. Ram Singh is Professor at the Delhi School of Economics (DSE), University of Delhi. He holds Ph.D. (JNU, New Delhi) and Post-Doctorate (Harvard) degrees in economics. His areas of research interests are contract theory, public economics, public private partnerships, and law and economics. He is a recipient of Fulbright, Commonwealth, and Erasmus Mundus Fellowships in economics Ronald Coase Fellowships in economics.



Dr. Amitabh Kundu is currently Distinguished Fellow at the Research and Information System for Developing Countries. He is chairing the Committee overviewing the survey for Swatch Bharat Mission (Rural) He was Regional Advisor on Poverty at UNESCWA, Beirut during 2017 and Consultant to the Government of Sri Lanka during 2016. Until January 2014, he was Professor at the Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. He has been the Dean of the School of Social Sciences and has served as a member of National Statistical Commission during 2006-08.




