

Kingdom of Bhutan, is a landlocked country in South Asia at the eastern end of the Himalayas. It is bordered to the north by China and to the south, east and west by India. To the west, it is separated from Nepal by the Indian state of Sikkim, while farther south it is separated from Bangladesh by the Indian states of Assam and West Bengal. Bhutan's capital and largest city is Thimphu. In the early 20th century, Bhutan came into contact with the British Empire and retained strong bilateral relations with India upon its independence. In 2006, based on a global survey, Business Week rated Bhutan the happiest country in Asia and the eighth-happiest in the world.

WHAT CAN BE PRESENTED

Research papers both empirical and conceptual, poster, regional experiences, model observations or any other academic material can be presented in this conference.

Each contributed paper should start with brief abstract. The abstract should state briefly the purpose of the research, the methodology incorporated and principal results and major conclusions. The word limit for the abstract is 200 - 250 words. Full paper based on the APA (American Psychological association style) can be submitted. Length of the paper should be 2500 to 3500 words.

The anthology of the Abstract shall be published and a soft copy of the same shall be given to each participants.

WHO CAN COME

A Delegate who is willing to present his paper can become part of this conference. The accompanying persons i.e. friends, family, acquaintances etc can also become part of the conference.

PUBLICATION

The Accepted full papers will be published in an Edited Book bearing ISBN. The Authors will be sent the format of the same upon approval.

How to Reach Thimphu, Bhutan

Thimphu is the capital city of Bhutan and is connected with all the major towns of the Kingdom. It is connected with India through AH-48, the main highway connecting the Indian town of Jaigon (West Bengal) i.e. 176 Kms away from Thimphu. Through Air, the nearest airport is Paro which is 45 Kms from Thimphu. Indian Airport Bagdogra (Siliguri) is also an option to reach Bhutan.

By Train:

One can easily get down at the nearby railway station connecting Guwahati and North Eastern part of India. From there phuentsholing or Jaigaon (border towns) can be easily reached by taxi or bus; the distance between Phuentsholing and major stations are as follows:

- I. Hasimara (HSA)- 18 Kms
- 2. AlipurDuar Junction (APDJ)- 60 Kms
- 3. New Alipur Duar (NOQ)- 65 Kms
- 4. New Cooch Behar (NCB)- 75 Kms
- 5. New Jalpaiguri (NJP)- 180 Kms
- 6. Kolkata (HWH or KOAA)- 650 Kms

These stations are nicely connected with all the major cities of India through express and superfast trains.

By Air:

The Bagdogra Airport (near Siliguri) is the nearest Airport of India to reach Bhutan; roughly 185 Kms from Phuentsholing from where one can easily get taxi or bus to reach Phuentsholing, Bhutan..

The Paro International Airport is connected by regular flights from Bangkok, Kolkata, Delhi, Bagdogra and Gaya. (www.drukair.com.bt).

The interested delegates may avail the bulk discount feature of Drukair through the organizing team of the conference.

The Weather at Thimphu, Bhutan:

Thimphu is usually pleasant during the period of June-July with showers and sun. The temperature ranges from 18 Degrees to 22 Degrees. The delegates coming from warm areas are recommended to carry warm clothes.

Immigration and Visa

All the non-Indian foreign participants have to secure their visa in advance from Department of Immigration. For Indian participants the Visa facility is available on arrival. The Scan copy of the official invitation has to be accompanied along with photocopy and original of passport (or Voter ID for Indian Nationals) and six Passport size photographs for immigration purposes.

Registration and Accommodation facilities at Thimphu

A limited number of participants can be registered on a first come and first serve basis (subject to acceptance of paper and submission of registration fees). Each registered outstation participant will be provided with free accommodation, food, and conference kit along with refreshments during the progress of the sessions. However, the local delegates will be provided with a conference kit, complimentary copy of publication and refreshment during progress of the sessions only.
